DEAF UTILIZE ELECTRONIC MAIL -- The GTE Telenet TelemailTM service introduced to reduce costs and improve communications in the business world has been adapted for use by the deaf. Called Deafnet, the system has been widely praised by deaf persons who participated in a three-year test.
